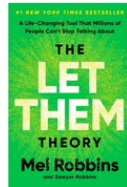

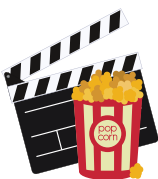


Classics Clique Movie

In this meeting, we will be watching part 1 of the movie *The Count of Monte Cristo* (2024).

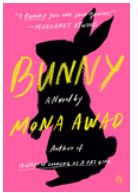

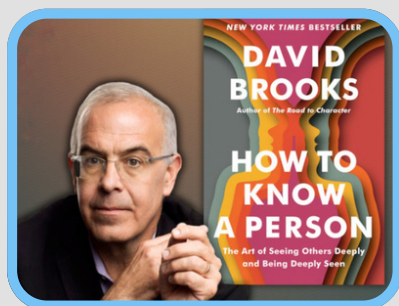

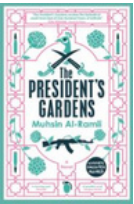
Read Around the World Book Group
