#### FRIENDS COMMITTEES

Now that the library has reopened and is running at full speed, it is time to gear up some of our committees to assist in both Library and Friends operations. The following are just three of the possible opportunities we have for you to become involved. If you are interested or have questions, please contact President Frank Ridley at fridley@cox.net.

#### 1. Membership Committee

The membership committee is responsible for maintaining the membership records of the Friends of the Meriden Public Library. Duties include contacting members at renewal time, attending community events to secure new members, designing and promulgating membership materials, suggesting ways to increase membership, and assisting the officers in setting membership rates.

#### 2. Fundraising Committee

The Friends of the Meriden Public Library has the responsibility to raise funds for library programs and events. This is done primarily through bookstore sales, dues income, and securing grants. The Fundraising Committee is responsible for designing, planning, and implementing other ways to raise money for the library. (An example is to secure a portion of the proceeds of a business on a particular day.)

### 3. Building and Grounds Committee

With increased garden areas on the library property and with an already stretched Public Works workforce, it is important to create a group to assist in the maintenance of the property. This is a great opportunity for those who are interested in gardening. Tasks include mulching the garden beds, weeding and maintaining the beds, and some planting.


# 3-D Paper Graveyard
