


















OUR READING CLUB FOR KIDS AGES 3-11 IS BACK AND IT'S BETTER THAN EVER!

Read, read! Every visit, your child will be eligible for a prize token for our Reading Gumball Machine when they read a certain number of books. This school year, we added golden tickets into the prizes. If they receive a prize capsule with a golden ticket, they get to pick a prize out of our treasure chest. The program concludes at the end of the school year.

Choose the Program that best fits your child's reading level.

Read to Me: Ages 3 and up. Your child does not read on their own yet or may know some words. Still requires a grownup to understand a story. Read 10 picture books, with a grownup, to earn a prize token.

Early Readers: Your child is reading sentences, paragraphs, or short chapters with some help from a grownup. Read 4 books on your own, or with some help from a grownup, to earn a prize token.

Independent Reader: Your child can read for long periods of time with little or no help from a grownup. They can finish a chapter book and understand the story. Read 1 chapter book to earn a prize token.

Track your progress online by registering your child on **meridenlibrary.beanstack.com** and choosing the program that is the best fit for your child or ask one of our children's staff for a paper tracker.




